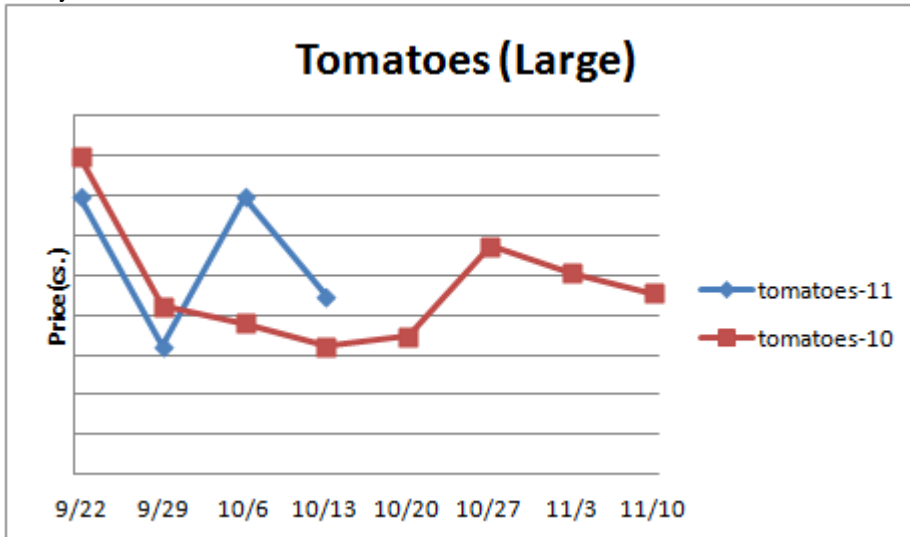


Produce Report

Produce- Heavy rainfall in California impacted tomato crops last week. Despite an improvement in weather, there is concern that western tomato supplies may be reduced during the next few weeks. Tomato crops in the east are transitioning to Florida as the fall progresses. Expect central Florida supplies to be ready later this month which may help fill any supply gaps. Some Salinas lettuce crops were also affected by the poor weather but the chief harvest area will be transitioning to Huron soon. Potato supplies are seasonally abundant but the potato markets may find support shortly.
